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NO HOMEWORK POLICY

1. Preamble

Education is a continuous process that should nurture curiosity, creativity, confidence and independent thinking among students. Innovator's Public School believes that learning is most effective when it takes place in a joyful, stress-free and supportive environment.

Homework has traditionally been used as a tool for reinforcement of classroom learning. However, excessive or repetitive homework may create unnecessary stress and reduce students' interest in learning. The school therefore adopts a balanced and child-friendly approach toward homework in accordance with modern educational practices and the developmental needs of children.

This policy aims to ensure that homework supports learning without creating academic burden and promotes the overall well-being of students.

2. Vision of the No Homework Policy

Innovator's Public School envisions an educational environment where learning is joyful, meaningful and free from unnecessary academic burden. The school believes that education should nurture the intellectual, emotional, physical and social development of every child.

The vision of this policy is to create a balanced approach toward learning in which students develop curiosity, creativity and confidence while maintaining healthy emotional and physical well-being. The school recognizes that meaningful education extends beyond textbooks and classrooms and includes experiences, observation, creativity, play and interaction with family and society.

5. Build Creativity and Critical Thinking

The school encourages imagination, innovation and problem-solving abilities through meaningful learning experiences rather than repetitive written work.

6. Promote Values and Life Skills

The school believes that education should develop discipline, responsibility, empathy, cooperation and decision-making skills that prepare students for life.

7. Foster Lifelong Love for Learning

The ultimate vision of this policy is to cultivate learners who enjoy acquiring knowledge, remain curious and continue learning throughout life.

3. Objectives of the No Homework Policy

The No Homework Policy has been framed to create a healthy and student-friendly learning environment while ensuring effective learning and holistic development.

1. To Reduce Academic Stress

The school recognizes that excessive homework may lead to stress, anxiety and loss of interest in learning. This policy aims to reduce unnecessary academic pressure and create a positive attitude toward education.

2. To Promote Joyful Learning

Learning should be enjoyable and engaging. The policy encourages activity-based, experiential and interactive learning experiences that make education meaningful and enjoyable for students.

3. To Encourage Independent Learning

Students should develop the habit of learning independently. Reading, observation and creative thinking are encouraged so that students become self-motivated learners.

4. To Support Holistic Development

Education is not limited to academics alone. Children require adequate time for sports, hobbies, family interaction, social activities and personal development. This policy supports balanced growth of students.

5. To Develop Creativity and Critical Thinking

Rather than repetitive written tasks, the school encourages assignments and learning activities that promote imagination, problem-solving and analytical thinking.

6. To Promote Healthy Lifestyle and Well-being

Adequate rest, sleep and recreation are essential for children's physical and emotional health. The policy ensures that learning does not adversely affect students' well-being.

7. To Encourage Quality Learning

4. Scope and Applicability of the Policy
